SGHA BOARD ACTIVITIES

LOWERING THE RAILROAD TRACKS - SAN GABRIEL TRENCH PROJECT

On February 9th the SGHA participated in a meeting at San Gabriel City Hall to discuss the construction schedule for the San Gabriel trench project and coordinate opportunities for history education. Attendees included City Manager Steve Preston, Councilman David Gutierrez and representatives from the Alameda Corridor - East (ACE) Construction Authority, SWCA Cultural Consultants, San Gabriel Unified School District and Washington Elementary School.

Highlights of the discussion:

- ACE expects to finish project engineering this year.
- 70% of the project funding is in place.
- Archaeological dig in front of the Mission, just south of the RR tracks will be tentatively set for Winter 2011.
- Project construction tentatively set to begin in the Spring of 2011 - Lasting three (3) years.
- Student historical education opportunities.

On April 24th the City of San Gabriel will be celebrating its 97th Birthday. In three short years the City will be celebrating its Centennial. The San Gabriel Historical Association and the City of San Gabriel have started planning the celebration of the City's Centennial. Sarah Mulock Duncan

Sarah Duncan was born on the 60-acre Mulock Ranch in North San Gabriel on May 17, 1919. Her grandparents settled in San Gabriel in December, 1865, purchasing 30 acres of land with a stream flowing from the canyon west of what is now the Huntington Library that supplied the San Gabriel Mission. Sarah was Curator of the San Gabriel Historical Museum from 1979 to 2002. This was a position she dearly loved and worked wholeheartedly at keeping our museum a treasury of historic information. The Board and members of the SGHA greatly appreciate her dedication to this work. She passed away in San Gabriel on January 7, 2010 at the age of 90.

Lonjina (Jina) Zuniga Gonzalez

She was born in Colton, California on March 15, 1905 and lived in the City of San Gabriel since the age of 6 months. She attended the newly built Lincoln School in San Gabriel. Lonjina married a San Gabriel resident, Lorenzo Gonzalez at the Presbyterian Church located on Mission Drive and Euclid Avenue. She reared 7 children and was blessed to leave grandchildren, great grand children and great-great-grandchildren numbering in the 100's. Jina was honored for her longevity at the age of 101 years by the City Council of San Gabriel. She was Grand Marshall of the 4 of July Parade in 2008. She was a delightful lady who did not drive, but walked everywhere. She was fluent in English and Spanish. Her mental skills were fully intact to the end. She passed away in Arcadia, California on January 25, 2010 at the age of 104. She is missed by many family members and friends.
