San Gabriel Chinatown?

Was there ever a San Gabriel Chinatown? Following a very interesting presentation by Suzie Ling, from PCC, some of our members walked a portion of the Mission District, looking for possible signs that there was indeed a Chinatown here in San Gabriel. The area was referred to in an article by Edwin Hayes published in the 1930's. It was located across from the Civic Auditorium and included laundries and markets. It may have continued southwest to the wash. So far no remaining evidence has been found.
